

Students on their marks with CBSE results; now get set, go

TRIUMPHANT Hard work, dedication has paid off, say principals and teachers

PUNE: The city schools have performed well in the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) Class 12 results which were declared on Thursday.

Anushka Krishna and Barnita Basanta, the students of Army Public School Kirkee that secure 100% pass percentage, scored 97.8 per cent in humanities. The school's Vibhu Sharma scored 97.6 per cent in science and Saurbh Jadhav 96.4 per cent in commerce to top in their streams.

Aadit Deshpande of Sanskriti School who scored 97.2 per cent said, "It was a surprise for me, as the results were declared early this year. I studied hard throughout the year and my parents supported me."

In the Global Indian International School, Chinchwad, 81 students appeared for the exam and all of them have passed. Mehak Johari and Madhura Gune scored 97.4 per cent each to top in the school in humanities. Sanskriti School registered 100 per cent result and Aadit Deshpande emerged as the school topper with 97.2 per cent. Devyani Mungali, director and founder of school, said, "Siddharth Mungale (93.2 per cent) and Snehal Kaushal (88.8 per cent) also excelled in music this year at a national competition Anveshan."

The students of City International School, Wanowrie, secured 100 per cent results. Of the 195 students that appeared for this year's board exam, 39 scored 90 per cent marks, 77 passed with distinction and 69 secured first class.
